Bhagwan Birsa Munda Jayanti Celebration

Aim & objectives

Birsa Munda was born on 15 November 1875 in the Khunti district of Jharkhand. He declared that he was sent by God to save his people from trouble, free them from the slavery.

British colonial rule and conversion activities in the areas of the Bengal Presidency, which today are part of Jharkhand. His rebellion in the Munda belt of Khunti, Tamar, Sarwada, and Bandgaon helped in the revival of traditional tribal culture.

Birsa Munda gave the slogan of 'Abua Raj Ete Jana, Maharani Raj Tundu Jana,' which translates as "Let the queen's kingdom end and our kingdom be established."

Birsa Munda died at the young age of 25 in British custody at the Ranchi jail. However, in his limited years, Birsa Munda's contribution to tribal causes earned him the title of 'Bhagwan' or Lord.
