Policy for Student Empowerment is prepared and has been approved by Governing Body. Following are the highlights:

- Incentive for Academic Research Publication in UGC Care / Scopus / SCI journals: One per Year, Maximum Rs. 5000/- per year per paper. Institute name must be in the affiliation.
- Incentive for Patent: Rs. 20,000/- per patent per year. Institute must be a party for the patent filed and granted.
- Participation in National level competitions: TA through shortest route, DA and Registration Fees, Competitions must be of National repute.
- Incentive for Toppers: Branch / Programme wise Class / Subject toppers in the University Examination.

- Prototype / Model / Project: Funding up to Rs. 10,000/- per Prototype / Model / Project per year, screening shall be by external person / expert.
- Incentive for On campus placement / Internship with highest package till declaration of University Result: Rs. 10,000/-, Only ONE including all Branches & Programme.
